## HARLEY REACHES NEW HEIGHTS IN WATER-SKIING COMPETITIONS!!

Harley Coster (10H) has achieved amazing results in major water-skiing competitions over the summer break.

He competed at the World Water-ski Championships in Calgary, Canada at the end of July as part of Team GB. As one of the youngest competitors skiing in an age category above his own, he did amazingly well and has settled his nerves for the next one in 2 years' time in Argentina which he will then be skiing in the correct age category of Under 17's.

In August Harley went on to compete at the European Water-ski Championships in Milan, Italy and skied in his U14 Category. He won five medals: Gold in Jump (jumped a personal best of 42 m), Bronze for Trick, Bronze for Slalom, Silver for Overall and Silver for Team GB.

The British Water-ski Federation wrote to him personally and said it was the best haul of medals from an individual in this age category in a very long time.

At the end of August Harley then skied in the British National Championships - Lincoln. He won four Gold medals for Jump, Slalom, Tricks and Overall and also broke the British Jump record with a jump of 43.9 m.

Currently Harley is first in the world rankings for Slalom and Jump and fourth for Tricking for the U14 category. His family are incredibly proud of him, as are all of us here at Collingwood. His hard work and dedication is definitely paying off!!!

#### Childhood Immunisations Given in Secondary School

The Immunisation Team are responsible for the planning and delivery of the school-age immunisation programmes in Surrey. The vaccination programmes are primarily carried out in schools, although we also offer clinics in other community settings for home-educated children and other children depending on their individual needs.

During your child's time at secondary school, they will be offered the following vaccinations:

Your child needs five doses of tetanus, diphtheria and polio to build up and maintain immunity. This is normally given at 8, 12, & 16 weeks and again aged 3, with the final dose given in Year 9. You can find your child's preschool vaccination history in their Red Book where early childhood immunisations should be recorded, alternatively, you should contact your GP.

Your school will liaise directly with you, at the appropriate time, in order to complete the necessary consent forms.
