



SPORTS DAY, ONCE AGAIN, A HUGE SUCCESS

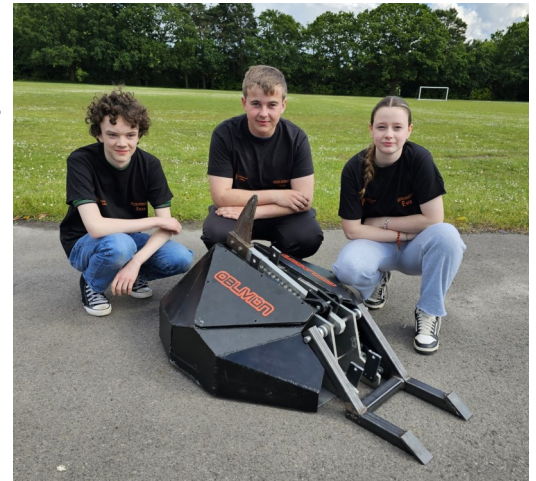

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ROBOT WARS CLUB PREPARE FOR EXTREME ROBOTS

Collingwood's Robot Wars Club has been running for 7 years and has created several fighting machines based on the BBC show. Our previous entry into the heavyweight category was Track-tion which competed in the final series of the TV show in 2017. Since then, the team has been building smaller machines to learn the skills needed to have another attempt at a larger robot. In December 2023, we decided to build a brand-new heavyweight competitor with the intention of entering the Extreme Robots and Mech Mania live shows across the country. After six months of solid effort from the team (Liam Lambert (Year 13), Enzo Melly-Amos (Year 12), Eva Hill (Year 11) and Sam Cox (Year 13)), our latest machine is ready to enter the arena.



Oblivion is a 110 kg heavyweight class robot, fitted with a pneumatic axe with almost 1 tonne of force and a flipper which can lift over 300 kg. To move around the arena, Oblivion has two motors from electric scooters which drive the wheel using chains. Lithium Polymer batteries from a large RC car provide the power with a CO2 cylinder for the weapons. The whole machine has a thick steel shell to protect it from attacks. The team has worked incredibly hard on Oblivion and the fact that this has been built entirely by the students with minimal help is a huge achievement.

Oblivion will be competing for the first time this weekend at Extreme Robots at the Guildford Spectrum. If you would like to see the show live, the last few tickets are available at www.extremerebots.co.uk.

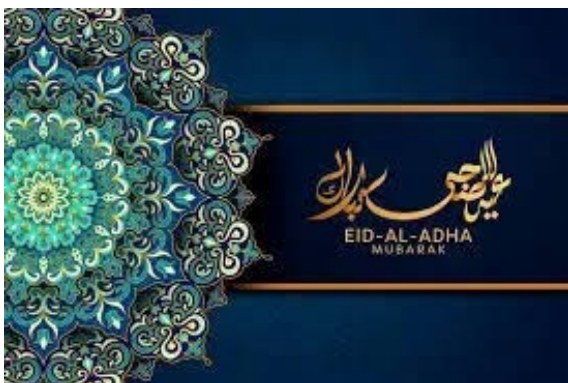

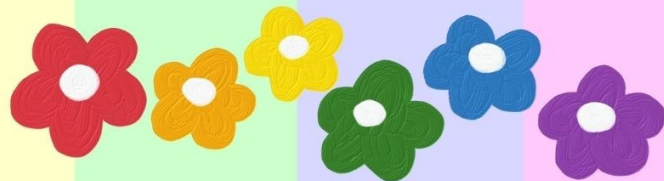

Enjoy the outdoors but 'be tick aware'

Ticks can transmit microbes that cause infections such as Lyme disease or tick borne encephalitis.

Being tick aware by using the following information can help to reduce the chance of tick bites and of being infected:

- you could be exposed to ticks whenever you spend time outdoors, including when in your garden or the local park
- ticks mainly attach to animals, but sometimes they may bite you, your family or your pets
- you can reduce the chance of tick bites by walking on clearly defined paths, using insect repellent and performing **regular tick checks**
- ticks can bite anywhere on the body, including in your hair. More than one tick can be attached to you at a time
- some tick bites can result in infection, so it is important to remove ticks safely and as quickly as possible
- the safest way to remove a tick is by using a pair of **fine-tipped** tweezers or a tick removal tool
- if you begin to feel unwell with flu-like symptoms, persistent headache, confusion or develop a spreading circular red rash (which usually appears within 1 to 4 weeks after being bitten), **contact your GP or NHS 111 promptly.** Mention if you were bitten by a tick or have recently spent time outdoors

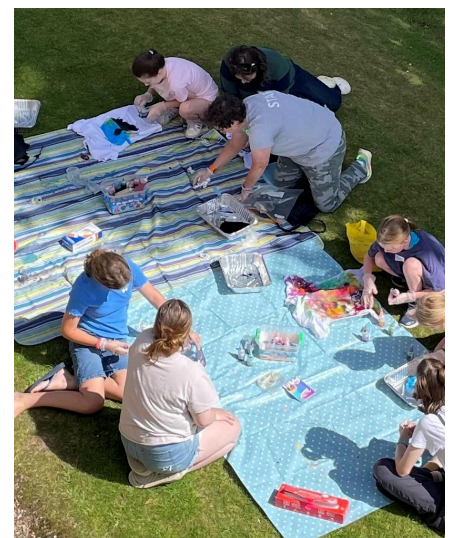

Our 2024 Teens Exploring Work Programme will be starting on 5th August for a group of 8-10 autistic girls and young people assigned female at birth, from Surrey (and surrounds), aged 15 and a half to 18 years. The programme takes place at Halstead St. Andrews School in Woking.

The teens involved will help plan and run activities for autistic girls aged 7-12 in hobbies like arts, crafts, baking, gaming, Forest School and more. The teens will also complete different activities, in small groups, to understand their own work skills and goals, being autistic and neurodivergent and how they can advocate for what they need in the future.

Appeer Teens Exploring Work Programme 2024- Information for Parents/Carers and Staff



Following our successful Teens Exploring Work programmes in the last 3 years, we are running a fourth programme for Surrey based autistic teenage girls and young people assigned female at birth aged between 16-18 this Summer (must have turned 16 or be turning 16 by 31/12/2024 or still be 18 on 1st September 2024). The objective of the programme is to provide an opportunity for social inclusion through work experience during our sessions for autistic girls aged 16-18, to develop employability and life skills as well as to support personal, social and wellbeing benefits.

Dates

This Summer, the programme will take place on:

- **Monday 5th August** 10:30am - 3:30pm – St Andrews School (10:30am -12:30pm employability skills development and 1:30pm-3:30pm girls activity planning)
- **Wednesday 7th August** 10:30am - 3:30pm – St Andrews School (10:30am -12:30pm employability skills development and 1:30pm-3:30pm girls activity planning)
- **Friday 9th August** 10:30am - 3:30pm – St Andrews School (10:30am -12:30pm employability skills development and 1:30pm-3:30pm girls activity planning)

There will also be a talk via Zoom in early August for parents/carers delivered by Rachel Pearson from AS Mentoring on preparing your young person for work and/or University.

If your teen is interested in taking part in this programme and is available in person on all of the key August dates (in bold), they can apply for the programme. Applications for the programme will be open from until **14th June at 9am**. Girls will be informed if their application has been successful by 24th June

2024. If there are lots of applicants, we may not be able to offer everyone a place. Older teens and people who live in Surrey will get priority places.

Benefits

- providing 'on the job' real work experience and helping the teens gain valuable work & life skills and mentoring to support future employability.
- hearing from autistic women about their experiences of work.
- helping the teens recognise and accept their strengths and challenges and how these can be both enablers and barriers in work and social situations.
- helping the teens collaborate, plan and deliver activities with their peers and be supported to develop skills to help them communicate and negotiate in tasks and social situations.
- helping the teens develop necessary life skills including researching, planning activities to a budget, preparing food and refreshment and more.
- promoting positive wellbeing and offering a space for the teens to share issues with staff/facilitators outside of the family.
- Providing opportunities for independence.

The programme will also:

- Provide a forum for parents/carers of the teens to find peer and specialist support including advice from a professional with experience of supporting autistic women in the workplace and from autistic women (talks/sessions will be arranged).
- Support many younger autistic girls and their families to benefit from activities and make links with older mentors.

Staff involved include

- Rachel Pearson – Appeer Director and AS Mentoring Autism Mentor supporting autistic adults to access work and further education placements and in work and life skills.
- Jo Dilworth – Appeer CEO with extensive education and charity experience and a neurodivergent woman.
- Kris Cornell – Appeer Girls Programme Manager.
- Casey Collin – Appeer Neurodiversity Facilitator.
- Further autistic women and Appeer staff members.




The report evidenced that only 12% of girls say being an engineer fits well with who they are and just 16% of girls think an engineering career is suitable for them.

Durham, LSE and Warwick have joined Imperial and Cambridge to incorporate the Test of Mathematics for University Admission (TMUA) into their selection process for 2025 entry. The world-class, research-intensive institutions will be using the TMUA to select students for a number of Maths and Statistics-based courses, as well as some in Economics, Computer and Data Science. The TMUA is one of two computer-based assessments that will be delivered by University Admissions Tests-UK (UAT-UK) for 2025 entry.



Long-awaited plans to award [UCAS points to apprenticeships](#) have been revealed by the university admissions body. From this September, people completing level 3 apprenticeships could be awarded up to 112 UCAS points to apply to universities, depending on the length of their apprenticeship. This is great news as it means you can do a Level 3 Apprenticeship at the end of Year 11 and still go onto university.
