

### COLLINGWOOD CELEBRATES DIVERSITY

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


### **COLLINGWOOD'S MURAL UNVEILED**

### PEER PRODUCTIONS PERFORM 'MAN UP' FOR YEAR 10 STUDENTS

On Thursday 27 March all Year 10 students watched a play called 'Man Up' performed by Peer Productions.

The play explores how gender stereotypes and patriarchal values impact everyone of all genders, how social media algorithms work and how they can impact perceptions of specific genders, how echo chambers function and how they can impact the ways in which an individual sees themselves and the world, the importance of critically questioning online information to develop a balanced sense of perception and perspective, the importance of supporting everyone's mental health



especially young men who may feel less able to ask for help, how sexual harassment negatively impacts people especially women and girls.

Year 10 students were engaged the whole time. Some of the content was a continuum of ageappropriate topics that they are already reviewing in this term's PSHE lessons. Seeing it brought to light by clever acting, creative setting and mood lighting was good to reinforce some of the dilemmas they are becoming aware of in the year group.

Spots are limited and tend to fill up quickly, so please ensure students sign up as soon as possible by visiting M2 or emailing Mrs Truglio.













### **SUCCESS STORIES**

Max's journey hasn't been easy. When he was at school, he was struggling with undiagnosed ADHD, autism and dyslexia, and not getting the support he needed. He was branded as the 'naughty kid' and ended up being excluded from school in Year 9.

His mum enrolled him in an alternative provision, where he gained his level 1 qualification in joinery and brickwork, and also secured his functional skills qualifications in maths and English.

This gave him a foundation to access the level 2 apprenticeship course in carpentry and joinery.

With the right support and his own determination, Max gained a distinction in his Level 2 qualification, which has given him the push to continue in education. He is looking to gain more knowledge and craftmanship by continuing to a level 3 apprenticeship.




